
PURIFICATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT



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Key Teachings



Judging from the Outside

Too often we judge others by what they wear or how they look. We see what is only on the outside. It takes time to really get to know someone—to look beyond the outside and to learn what another person thinks, believes, likes, and feels.

Have you ever been judged based on what is on the outside? If so, what happened? How did you feel?

Have you ever judged someone based on what is on the outside—their clothes, how they look, how they act, or how they talk?

God Sees Into the Heart

God looks beyond the outside, into the heart. God sees and knows who we are: our habits—good and bad—our talents, and our dreams. While we cannot know someone else as well as God does, we can ask the Holy Spirit to help us see others as God sees them. We can ask for God's help in accepting and not judging others.

Reflection

This week, keep thinking about Christ, the Light of the world. Talk with him about what you are feeling and about what you need. Ask him the questions that are on your heart. Be still and listen to what he says to you.

What habits or attitudes do you need to change in order to walk as a child of the light?
