# God's Story

The many books of the Bible are organized into two sections: the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament contains the Ten Commandments and many other of God's Laws, history, prophetic books, and wisdom books. The New Testament focuses on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. It contains the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John), the Acts of the Apostles, the letters of Saint Paul and other Apostles, and the Book of Revelation.



- The Bible is also called Sacred Scripture.
  - The Bible is the Word of God set down in human language.
  - Through the Bible God speaks to us, telling us of his love for us.


#### **Apostles**

## Saint Jerome (341-420)

When Saint Jerome was young, the Bible was not written in a language people could understand. Jerome could read and understand the Bible because he went to good schools. He knew the Bible was God's Word, and he wanted everyone to be able to read and understand it. The pope gave him the job of translating the Bible from Hebrew and Greek to Latin. It took him thirty years to write it by hand. Jerome's translation became known as the Vulgate Bible and was the standard Bible for the Roman Catholic Church for hundreds of years. Saint Jerome is honored

> as one of the four great Doctors (important teachers) of the Western Church. The Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Jerome on September 30.
