God's Story

God alone forgives our sins, no matter how big they are. Of course, we have to be honest about our sins and we have to be sorry for them. If we are, God's love can heal us. We will find new life in God's Son, Jesus, whose name means "God saves."



- Salvation is ours as a free gift from God.
- Even when we hurt ourselves and others by sinning, God is always ready to forgive.
- God does not hold our sins against us if we ask for his mercy.
