
Divine Revelation

Saul of Tarsus/Saint Paul (c. 4-c. 64)

Saul of Tarsus was a Jewish Roman citizen who hated Christians. He was on his way to Damascus to arrest some Christians when he was blinded by a bright light and heard the voice of Jesus speaking to him. Saul could not see for three days. On the third day, Ananias, a disciple of Jesus, laid hands on Saul and Saul was healed. He took the name Paul, was baptized, and soon began to travel and preach the Gospel. He preached about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Saint Paul was not welcome everywhere he went. He was arrested, put in prison, and even put to death because of his faith in Jesus. The Church celebrates the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, the Apostle, on January 25.
