Saint Joan of Arc (1412–1431)

Joan of Arc lived by the motto, "Let God be served first." Joan grew up in France at a time when England and France were at war. She believed that God was calling her to help France, so she became a soldier and led France during the war. When in battle, Joan of Arc carried a flag called a standard. On the standard was a picture of God in Heaven, and pictures of the archangels Michael and Gabriel worshiping God. The holy names of Jesus and Mary were written on the standard in letters of gold. The leaders of France did not approved of Joan.They had her killed when she was just nineteen years old. The Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Joan of Arc on May 30.
