## Saint Teresa of Jesus (1515-1582)

Saint Teresa of Jesus (Saint Teresa of Ávila) loved to read stories about the saints with her brother, Rodrigo. When she was eighteen, Teresa became a nun. As time went on, she found that she did not want any more things. She only wanted a closer relationship with God. She taught others to live simply and to spend more time in prayer. Saint Teresa could pray in silence for many hours at a time. She wrote books about prayer and about how to worship God. She was joyful and beautiful, and so wise that she was the first woman to be named a Doctor of the Church. The Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Teresa of Jesus on October 15.

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
